Prof. Bonora's research has focused on antiretroviral treatment, including clinical management and clinical pharmacology of antiretroviral drugs. He is the medical responsible of the Laboratory of Clinical Pharmacology and Pharmacogenetics of Antiretrovirals of the University of Torino. He collaborated in numerous studies of HIV treatment as an expert of clinical pharmacology of antiretrovirals. He is involved in national and international CME programs for physicians treating HIV-positive patients. He has authored over 300 scientific manuscripts concerning comorbidities in HIV, clinical management of HIV infection and drug metabolism, pharmacogenetics and drug-drug interactions of antiretrovirals. Prof. Bonora's publications have appeared in leading journals, such as *The Lancet*, *AIDS*, *Antiviral Therapy*, *Antimicrobial Agents and Chemotherapy*, *Journal of Antimicrobial Chemotherapy*, *Clinical Infectious Diseases*.
